
Doctors' Day Carnation Pins 2022 - 2023





Goal

- The Goal of the project was to distribute the pins in appreciation of our physicians in attendance at our Annual State Convention usually held the first weekend in April a few days past Doctor's Day on March 30th.
- Fresh carnations are costly and last a few days.
- Pins can be worn all year round.
- Pins were distributed at our Annual meeting in Kansas City, Missouri in April 2023 with the presence of our AMA Alliance President, Mrs. Jacqueline Nguyen following my HOD address.

Process

- Located an online retail company and spent time on design concept.
- After several attempts and drafts, came back with the desired rendering of a carnation.
- Originally was going to be a Kansas City Metro County project, but The MSMA Alliance board moved to cover the total cost and make it a State project in October 2022.
- Total Cost = \$ 640 for 300 pins.
- Total Time and duration from design to delivery of product April July 2022.
- The MSMA Alliance created a page on its web page reciting the history of Doctor's Day and how it came about to be celebrated on March 30th annually.
- The cards were designed and prepared by our MSMA Liaison officer with a QR code to direct users to our page and and read the background behind the day. www.MSMA.org/alliance
- Following out Winter board meeting in February of 2023, members worked on attaching the pins to the card to be ready for distribution by Annual meeting in April 2023.

- ▶ 1 in 5 doctors plan to leave the profession in the next 2 years.

- In 2021 1 in 10 physicians considered or attempted suicide. Each year, roughly 400 physicians die by suicide.

Dr. Lorna Breen, before taking her own life, was primarily concerned what the effect of seeking mental health care would have on her career.





"Ponchos for People"


